President's Report

On behalf of the committee, we have the pleasure in presenting the 37th Annual Report of the East Malvern Junior Football Club, together with the duly audited financial statement for the year end of 30th September 2022.

Season 2022 – Club & Community Highlights

Quite simply to commence the season as scheduled and to have played a full season without any restrictions was certainly one and maybe the highlight of the year when considering the events of the past two years.

It was fantastic to see footy return to normal and see the players across all the age groups training and regularly playing every week with such enthusiasm and the huge smiles on their faces. This is what being involved in a Junior Football Club and Local Community is all about for me & I am sure that all would agree.

The committee would also like to congratulate all the players, volunteers and mums & dads this season on the way they have conducted themselves and represented the club. This culminated in 14 out of a possible 22 teams making finals which delivered four premierships to the club this season. The Premiership teams were the U13 Girls Division 1, U11 Mixed Division 4, U14 Boys Division 1 and U16 Boys Division 2. Also a special mention to the players who represented the club in interleague and the Vic Metro side this year, congratulations on your achievements.

With social events kept to a minimum this year the Annual Presentation Day was certainly the social highlight of the season. It was wonderful to see so many Mighty Knights Players and Families together to celebrate our first full season in three years including the participation of so many people in the Worlds Greatest Shave to support the Leukemia Foundation and the Hegan Family – Thank You!

Financial Statement

The clubs financial position remains sound. Due to the past committee's diligent and hard work the club's finances were in an enviable position to deal with the impacts of the Covid Pandemic. We were able to refund registration fees to those families severely impacted by COVID as well as roll over approximately 600 registrations from the 2020 season to the 2021 season at a cost of more than \$100,000.

The capital expenditure for the new scoreboards has been another major investment that has been completely and entirely funded by the club and will only enhance the seasons to come. A full copy of the audited financials will be available and made public at the AGM.

Secretary's Report

After years of disruption, we finally managed to get in a full season. There were many happy Knights running around on the ovals each week which was fantastic to see! Due to the fact that Auskick hadn't operated for two years (so a lower number of kids coming in to U8 as we didn't have Auskick as a "feeder"), numbers were down on last year however we still had almost 800 players register with the Mighty Knights! We fielded 34 teams in 2022.

We had teams ranging from U8 to U11 mixed, U12-U16 boys & amp; U8 to U18 girls (including the additional of new girls age groups U8 & U13). Club numbers were down compared to last year, but we hope to be back up to 850-900 players again next year. The League is introducing another two new girls age groups next year (U11 & U15) which is a great plus for the girls as some younger players struggle with the 2 year gap between age groups. There are also ongoing discussions between the League & the AFL about changing U17.5 boys to U18 boys so stay tuned for updates.

Our key focus of providing a safe environment for our kids & parents to enjoy football, supporting the development of our players and encouraging respect & integrity within the Knights community continues. We thankfully had a year relatively free of "incidents" which was fantastic. This shows that the standards that the coaching teams instil in our players is working!

In my fifth year in the club secretary role I have continued to work closely with the SMJFL & built relationships with the new members of the team (CEO Matthew Brown, GM Football Operations Bree Valance, Umpire Coordinator Doug Haworth & Marketing & Communications Coordinator Zac Jennings) as well as building on the previously established strong relationships with long termers such as Cam Watts. The League also welcomed Dale Wain into the newly created role of General Manager – Clubs & Community & we look forward to working with Dale next year. We liaised with the team at the League with regards to fixtures & amp; ensured that all games were at the appropriate times & that all matches fit on our three ovals. The League did a good job of managing the many fixtures & were receptive to our suggested changes in the majority of instances.

A big thanks to the League and all Mighty Knights players, volunteers & parents who continue to work together to make the Knights the wonderful club that it is. And many thanks to my fellow committee members for all their hard work over the year (including all the sub-committee members who work "behind the scenes"). Without the substantial amount of time they put into supporting the club, we would not be the club that we are today. We also have some fantastic, passionate new committee members coming on board next year. I look forward to working with them in my last year at the Knights.

EMJFC Football Department – Mick Hegan, Carl Callenbach, Lori Embelton

The Football Department began its work for the 2022 season in September of 2021. By October 2021 the following preparations had commenced:

- Coaching expressions of interest had begun with those appointed for 2021
- Est of all age groups re players for 2022 for the purposes of team nominations to SMJFL
- Nominations of players for St Kilda NGA and SMJFL Interleague purposes
- Appointment of specialist coaches, BD Sports, kicking skills and Malcolm Bangs, tackling.
- Appointment of age group co-ordinators for each year level
- Timetables and venues for pre-season training
- Organisation of some pre-season games both internal and external
- Accreditation from AFL via Coach.AFL for all Knights coaches
- Liaising with Malvern District Auskick regarding potential numbers for under 8's
- Updating the Football Policy
- Owing to Covid restrictions we didn't pursue the annual Mosman extravaganza

Participation numbers

The 2022 season was to be the season that saw football return in full flight after significant Covid pandemic interruptions. Official footy competition commenced for all clubs in April with a pre- season completed prior.

The club retained a solid percentage of existing players whilst also attracting new players from outside the club. The team participation was to be 34 teams, down 4 from 2021.

The club continues to grow particularly in the girl's divisions.

The traditional feeder primary schools in the local area, Malvern Primary, Lloyd Street, St Marys, St Rochs, Solway and Caulfield Grammar made up the majority of under 8-10 players. The club is also represented by other local schools in the local community being St Michael's, Malvern Central, St Josephs, Carnegie Primary, Melbourne Montessori, Essex Heights & Ashwood.

What changed in 2022

Given recent experience, and consistent with clear expectations communicated by the SMJFL, the club commenced internal hard grading at under 12 boys for one of the 3 teams, soft grading continued for u11 Mixed teams. The league introduced a U12 Girls non modified section whilst maintaining a modified section and u13 Girls commenced this year.

EMJFC Football Operations – Patrick Charles, Jonathan Brown

For the first time in 3 years we had a full season – so after 2 'full years' of prep and pack-up – we finally got to have a go at the fun stuff... actual football.

After initially committing to being grounds manager, we struggled to get an ongoing commitment from Nish in the role, and subsequently needed to recruit. With thanks to the Old De La community, we got Matt and Jerry who stepped into the role very well. Having the 2 Ground Mangers meant that unlike in previous years where we had been required to help with the pack-down every week, this was achieved without the committee assisting (most of the time). Matt and Jerry have both indicated they are keen to return for 2023 – which means with ERC training, and the year's experience, we are in for a much better Sunday experience next year!

The commissioning of the scoreboards was a blessing and a curse! Lots of time to get them up and running, but it was great to see the Lucas Board in action for the last few games of the year. Patty stepped in as the 'lead tech' for the boards – and we will run training for all TMs for the start of the 2023 season.

We have approached the Council to improve the storage facilities at Stanley (and Basil) – attempting to get a more permanent undercover scorers space (under the scoreboard) with storage for the goal pads and tents.. but this is still very much a work in progress.

After initial delays in receiving match footies from the SMJFL we are now well stocked with both training and match footballs for the 2023 season... and so the focus moves to replacing the aging (and with old sponsors) jumper sets – something we will sort out at the Annual General Meeting no doubt.

The senior club have agreed to share another one of the external storage sheds with us – which has meant that our equipment was much more effectively stored at the end of the season – and will remain so moving forward. If we transition to double sided jumpers, then the effective storage in the ops store will also increase moving forward, and the workload in Ops on a Friday night will also reduce.

From an operational perspective, the new marquees and walkie talkies were a great addition – making grounds management much improved.

For 2023 we have recruited the wonderful Bart and Caz Drew to join the team (in a shared role), and as Jono/Patty enter their 4th year in the role... surely we know what we are doing now!

Communications Report – Anne Moore

In 2022 the aim was to build further on a consistent and engaging presence for our members through regular updates of game day photos and upcoming events throughout the season via social media. A reminder to follow our instragram / facebook pages has been added to our regular newsletters to members.

Our website saw a slight decrease in site views from 8702 in 2021 to 8333 in 2022 (a 4% decrease which is slightly less than the decrease in members for the 2022 season) with 7045 unique visitors. The majority of visitors utilized google to find the website or went direct. Our website is mainly used for registrations and merchandise sales, however at the conclusion of the season we added a Photo Gallery which we hope will draw more repeat visitors during the season.

We now have 1405 followers on Instagram (16% growth on last year) & 905 followers on Facebook (8% increase on 2021). Our social media posts have also grown in engagement with an average reach on Facebook of 258 for photos and 292 for video posts, with the largest reach for a single post being 1.2k. On Instagram our highest engagement post came from the surprise visit of Prime Minister His Honourable Scott Morrison with 422 interactions and an engagement rate of 26%.

In 2023, in conjunction with our new Sponsorship manager/s we will be aiming to provide greater return on investment for our sponsors through targeted promotion throughout the season both via newsletters and social media.
