President's Report

1. On behalf of the Committee it is my pleasure to present the 40th Annual Report for the East Malvern Junior Football Club Inc, together with audited Financial Statement for year-end 30 September 2025.

Season 2025 – Club and Community Highlights

2. This year we had 37 teams competing across age groups from U8's through the U16. We still enjoy a healthy position in the SMJFL as one of its biggest Clubs.
3. We enjoyed premiership success in the U14 Girls' Division 2 and U16 Girls' Division 1.
4. A Club such as ours cannot function without the endless commitment and devotion of our volunteers. Once again I extend my thanks to all our AGC's, coaches, team managers and team volunteers.

Social Events

5. For the third consecutive year we have run out Night of Knights social function. This was held at the East Malvern RSL and well attended. Many thanks to our social sub-committee: Mel Hope, Tam Garvey, Bec Odgers and Fiona McWilliams for organising the event.
6. Our Welcome Night on Friday, 28 March 2025 was a huge success once again. The transition from a Welcome Day, normally held on a Sunday, to a Welcome evening on the last Friday before the Term 1 holidays, means there is a greater opportunity for attendance for all of our members, particularly our new members, to permit them to get merchandise and also introduce our new and existing members to the wonderful team at MDT Dentistry for the selection of and fitting of mouthguards. Many thanks to all of our members who assisted with the preparation for and coordination of the evening.
7. This year saw a change in our friendly Friday night bar staff. Olympia Sutherland and Angus McWilliams joined the Club as the ever-ebullient hosts on Friday evenings. They were joined later in the season by Gracie Cosgrave. Thanks also to Annabel Embelton who filled in occasionally, particularly towards the end of the season and our end of season pizza nights. Our bar sales enjoyed a much greater turnover this year than in previous years which is due in large part to the friendly and helpful staff we had behind the bar.
8. I must also acknowledge the wonderful contribution that our new canteen operator, Liz, has made this season. Our 2025 season began with nearly 800 players registering for the East Malvern Knights across 38 teams. This represents a slight increase from last year, with strong participation across every age group—from U8s through to U16s.

Once again, we have enjoyed an excellent retention rate, with most age groups fielding multiple teams. We also welcomed a number of new players from other clubs, many drawn to our strong culture and the opportunity to play alongside their school friends. Congratulations to the Footy Department and all coaching teams for fostering an environment that our players are proud to be part of.

This season delivered outstanding on-field success. Two of our teams secured premierships, and as a club we saw 16 of a possible 25 teams qualify for finals. Congratulations to our U14 Div 2 and U16 Div 1 girls' teams on winning their premierships! A tremendous achievement for all involved.

We were also proud to once again host SMJFL finals, successfully delivering three consecutive weekends of finals football. Having multiple home finals in the first week created a fantastic atmosphere, with many members of the Knights community coming out to support our teams. EMJFC Football Department 2025 - Mick Hegan, Lori Embelton, Andrew Wilson, Jamie Diab

The Football Department team began our work for the 2025 season in September of 2024. Preparing for a new season always has different challenges and new ideas. A major focus was about our preparation for a new look preseason which would include using Central Park for all age groups for the majority of preseason and the Carlton Football Club indoor facility.

Central Park had been used previously but not to the extent of time as per the preseason of 2025. The location is perfect, space is sufficient for all age groups, the main challenge is the age group roster as to when certain age groups should train owing to other commitments and when younger age groups should commence.

There are always learnings, the major learning is that no age group wants to miss out. When January holidays conclude, footy season is the major topic of discussion in households, registrations to be completed, kids asking questions at the dinner table, e.g. when does footy training start? All due respect to cricket, but footy is the focus for many local families with kids.

It was agreed Central Park was terrific, local shops providing a much-needed cold drink on hot days and or a form of carbs to fulfil the hunger after training. Not to mention an opportunity for parents or grandparents to grab a coffee or something a little more tantalising whilst the kids trained quite close by.

Access to the Carlton Football Club indoor facility was the idea of Andy Wilson and Tom Langford. We were able to use this wonderful facility through Tom Langford (Carlton Dev coach). Tom had come on board for preseason 2025 with Robbie Nahas via the exceptional negotiation skills of Andy Wilson.

The coach info session was an overwhelming success with a attendance of 32 parents covering coaches and committee. Tom Langford facilitated the session, supported by Lori Embelton, Andy Wilson and Jules Hay. In short, the session covered theory including warmups, suitable training drills and followed by practical demonstration of some drills which enabled attendees to participate and practice.

Another new brainwave was Friday night 'Coach engagement education & sharing experience sessions' held in the change rooms which were conducted by Tom and Andy. These sessions served a two-fold purpose

- Coaches could ask about appropriate drills for certain learnings
- Coaches were able to share good and poor experiences enabling help to be provided
- Langers or Andy were able to talk about match day circumstances, focus on what and when, use the time well etc.
- Ideas to help with the kid's engagement at training and match day

This new approach was the idea of a very energetic and enthusiastic Andy Wilson.

March 25 many discussions via email, phone and meetings had transpired which enabled the Footy Department to be in good shape for the forthcoming season.

- Jamie Diab joined the footy department.
- EOI discussions had begun with those who had been appointed in 2023.
- Est of all age groups re players for 2024 for the purposes of team nominations to SMJFL.
- Nominations of players for Saints NGA and SMJFL Intraleague.
- Appointment of specialist coaches, BD Sports for kicking skills, Malcolm Bangs for tackling and Robbie Nahas for specific coaching in pre-season across some boys and girls age groups.
- Appointment of age group co-ordinators for each year level.

- Liaison with Council and local cricket clubs for the purpose of establishing timetables & venues for pre-season training.
- Organisation of some pre-season games both internal and external.
- Understanding of the new coach accreditation process from AFL via Coach.AFL for coaches.
- Liaising with Malvern District Auskick regarding potential numbers for under 8's.
- Updating the Football Department Policy.
- Owing to Covid restrictions we didn't pursue the annual Mosman trip.
- Assisting AGC's with team selection. Referral to club policy for age groups.
- Club information session for coaches.
- Introduction of the 'Coach Charter'. Presented at Coach and TM info sessions.
- Preparation of the training roster for winter.

Participation numbers

The club retained a solid percentage of existing players whilst also attracting new players from outside the club. The team participation was to be 38 teams, up on 35 teams in 2024.

Overall, our participation numbers for 2025 were slightly up on 2024 by 43.

- 32 schools were represented by girls
- 46 schools were represented by boys

What changed in 2025

The league introduced U8 girl's, the Knights were one of the 2 inaugural participating clubs along with East Brighton. Given there was only 2 u8 teams, these teams played in an U9 Girls comp. East Malvern girls were outstanding, winning many games and having a ball. Shout out to Ben McKie (coach), Emma Hutchison (Asst Coach) and Alina Malkin (AGC / TM).

Soft and Hard grading of age groups.

Given recent experience, and consistent with our club philosophy the club didn't hard grade u11 boys which some other clubs most certainly do. It has been the committees view that kids in these age groups should continue to share some friendships and experience movement from a previous team to meet other kids and families in our community. We did grade u12 boys for the first time, our third team didn't win a game, however it should be noted that the league wants clubs to hard grade u12 mixed.

U11 Boys Div 3 suffered, whilst our u16 Boys Div 3 were dealt another tough gig for the third successive season despite requests to regrade.

Healy had an outstanding season, not only excelling within his own team but also supporting other U11 teams when they needed extra players.

Overall, it was a season full of growth for all players.

Pre-Season Planning

The pre-season period was problematic due to unclear and inconsistent communication around dates and times of training. This lack of clarity caused confusion among leadership group & parents causing frustration for many.

Recommendation: The club needs to provide a clear schedule well in advance, outlining exact days, times, and expectations for all age groups and stick to it. This could be looked at now and tentatively worked on.

Coaching and appointments I would encourage the club to remind coaches to avoid making promises about team selections etc to parents, these cannot be guaranteed and when they are not met the AGC bears the brunt of these deals. Furthermore, any discussions about potential coaches and appointing of them from the club needs to be communicated to the AGC.

Team Announcements

Again, this year there was miscommunication about when teams could be announced. Some teams announcing days before others etc. Whilst I understand that part of the reason for keeping announcements close to Round 1 is to reduce issues of disgruntled parents, it makes the role of AGC and TMs incredibly hard. We cannot properly set up parent volunteer roles keeping teams a secret for that long. Roles like trainers, TM's etc need to go through training therefore announcing them in late May would be far more constructive.

Grading

Significant grading issues were identified. In particular, the Betheras team was not moved to Division 4 despite repeated requests, which resulted in a season of heavy defeats. This not only affected competitive balance but may also impact some boys' enthusiasm and willingness to return next year. It was also clear this season the difference between our teams and the cohesion of many other clubs. These clubs' grade from earlier ages, and it would be a recommendation the EMJFC look at hard grading from U10's onwards.

Team Numbers and Availability

All three teams carried 20–21 players each. While this seemed adequate on paper, in practice it was insufficient. Each week, player absences due to illness, family commitments, or other activities left squads short. Teams often had to scramble for fill ins.

Recommendation: A bare minimum of 24 players per team is needed moving forward to ensure consistent numbers and avoid weekly shortages.

Communication

There were some incidents that occurred over the season that ACG's were not made aware of by the club, therefore when TM's consulted for advice, it was disappointing to have not been updated and hearing it for the first time via TM's.

A season calendar with event dates confirmed would be beneficial to hand out to parents at the start of the season. This includes any special events such as TeamSports, All round or BigFreeze rounds.

The team benefited from a unique coaching group of five, including a senior coach and four assistant coaches. This structure allowed the assistant coaches to focus on line coaching, providing targeted support and development for the players in specific positions. However, coordinating such a large group also presented some challenges, requiring clear communication and collaboration to ensure a unified approach. The coaching group will revisit this approach ahead of next season.

Looking Ahead

The lessons learned during this season will benefit the U13 girls as they continue to develop their skills and passion for AFL. With continued opportunities for development, we will again be seeking a finals berth in div 1 in 2026.

U15 Girls Randall – Division 1

2025 Season Summary

- Promoted to Div 1 after the 2024 Div 2 premiership.
- Tough season, but the right division despite noise from other clubs.
- Fixture issues: SMJFL began with only 4 teams in Div 1 and ten in Div 2,
- Then added a 5th after two rounds, forcing a restart of season and introducing a bye every third week.
- Record: 13 games, 3 wins.
- Won the semi-final, lost the preliminary final.

Considerations for 2026

- Push SMJFL early to commit to at least 6 teams in U16 Div 1.
- Make the case that girls should play weekly – no byes every third week.
- Divisions should be merit-based: top 6 in Div 1, no exceptions.

Squad

- 31 registered players (cap was 30; one extra slipped through!).
- Two on a waiting list – one ended up playing U16.
- Rostered players weekly, always fielded 20. This structure is now well embedded.
- Availability challenges (Year 9 camps, injuries, other sports) averaged 9.4 players unavailable each week.
- Only 2.6 were rostered out on average, which is a win and players and parents consider acceptable considering the squad size.

Considerations for 2026

- Keep the 30-player cap in 2026, with clear first-come-first-served comms.
- Expect some attrition but still healthy numbers.
- Note: Two U15 teams in 2026 would require ~48 players to cover weekly availability gaps.
- Suggest to start with a cap of 30 and a waitlist to gauge demand, with upfront communication and timelines.

General Considerations for 2026

Club comms can be streamlined to save committee time. WhatsApp is overloaded with repeat questions – a structured, pre-prepared FAQ approach would help.

Suggested categories:

- Preseason Admin – step-by-step guide for registering coaches, trainers, players, parents, team managers; deadlines for team selection etc.
- Football Ops – One-stop-shop for recurring footy ops questions - Jumpers, TM bags, balls, cage access etc
- Merchandise – ordering process, collection, availability etc
- Training – early release of schedules; lights on/off instructions!!
- Game Day – TM responsibilities, Parent roles (do's and don'ts), ground manager contacts, PlayHQ requirements,
- By-Laws – there are a few recurring By-Laws referred to that can be simply summarised
- Incident Reporting – Templates created for foul play, behaviour, concussion etc
- Events – comms for presentation nights, BBQs, charity event etc (ad hoc)

Suggest to assign one person per section to consolidate info into a doc before season starts, and one to oversee comms. Link FAQs in relevant group chats and ALWAYS direct questions there first. This should create habit of people checking FAQs BEFORE asking questions and cut 80% of unnecessary traffic and free the committee to focus on running the club.

Happy to help with any of the above. We already have something for Preseason Admin that was created this year. Love you all.

The Under 16 boys program grew to 57 registered players in 2025, following strong recruiting efforts early in the year. This was in stark contrast to early in the registration period, where real consideration was being given to merging with another club to make two teams.

Milestones

2025 was a standout year for player achievements:

- **Bruce Fox award** as Co-captains of the U16 Div 1 team to **Darby Dore** and **Ollie Chapman**
- **Div 1 team – grand final runner ups**
- **Div 3 team – reserve grand final runner ups**

Division 1 – Mahoney

Andrew Wallis returned as **Head Coach**, supported again by **Tim Chapman**, with the Pres stepping in on occasion as either coach or assistant coach (results were much better when he was Assistant Coach....). Pete Chalikias ably stepped into the TM role this year, and did a great job of managing the team and parent duties.

The team embraced a strong culture of accountability and leadership, with expectations and non-negotiables reaffirmed at the start of the season. We had some great new recruits again this year who made an immediate impact, strengthening the squad and contributing to a competitive season.

This also meant a number of boys who had played Div 1 in prior seasons went down to play Div 3. Other obstacles for consistency included a number of the top ten players being absent for much of the season, due to other duties with school teams or Coates League, meaning managing a sub-strength team week in week out for the coaches.

Whilst the team finished about 4th on the ladder, 9 games were decided by less than 10 points, and many of the losses amongst those the boys should have won.

A decisive win over the top ranked team in the final round really lifted the boys come finals, with solid wins in the elimination and preliminary final earning them a place in the Grand Final.

The grand final was disappointing, with poor umpiring and significant injuries to key players early in the game, including a sickening concussion from a dangerous tackle resulting in arguably our best and most influential player being rushed to hospital. As this happened metres from our bench, the boys were shaken and many never recovered.

Additional injuries and a lack luster performance for the remainder of game resulted in a 36 point grand final loss.

Division 3 – Carroll

With **Andrew Trotter** stepped up as coach for his third season in a row, and this year he was joined by Hawthorn super coach (and son) Harrison Trotter, and once again ably supported by **Team Manager Stef Brunetti**. Team Carroll faced another challenging year, with persistent efforts to be in a division for which they could compete thwarted by trying to do the right thing.

Following a couple of large wins over one rubbish team, they were elevated to Division 3 after grading had been finalised, which caused yet again significant unhappiness and frustration amongst the squad, with the coach taking it harder than anyone. Despite this they continued the season, putting in a great effort against often significantly bigger and better teams. Team Carroll ended 7th of 9 in Div 3, winning 3 games post elevation.

The reserve finals series Division 3 was a shemozzle, with team Carroll making it into the Reserve Grand Final without playing a single final, due to forfeits in protest by the other teams. Whilst giving it there all and having a late charge in the 3rd quarter, they were beaten in the end by 52 points.

While the shift brought new ideas and energy, it also required time to understand processes, refine communication pathways, and clarify expectations. These learnings will shape a more structured and clearly defined operational approach next season, ensuring greater consistency and clarity across all football-related functions.

Communications Report – Anne Moore

The 2025 season delivered strong growth across all communication channels, with the club's digital presence expanding significantly in both reach and audience engagement. Website performance improved notably, with **9,525 site sessions**, up from **8,724 in 2024**, reflecting increasing reliance on the website for fixtures, registration, and club information. Unique website visitors also rose from **5,005 to 5,161**, demonstrating broader community awareness and a steady flow of new and returning users accessing club resources throughout the year.

Across social media, the club recorded its strongest engagement to date. Instagram followers grew from **1,965 to 2,251**, while Facebook increased from **928 to 947**, reinforcing consistent year-on-year audience expansion. Average reach rose significantly on both platforms, with Facebook climbing from **120 to 301** and Instagram from **412 to 471**, driven by stronger content planning, more frequent video updates, and real-time match-day storytelling. Instagram's total reach more than doubled, increasing from **14,374 to over 37,800**, highlighting substantial uplift in visibility. The season's best-performing post was the **U15 Division 1 first win of the year (Round 10, July 20)**, achieving an exceptional **4,616 reach, 72 shares, 544 interactions**, and generating **five new followers**—a clear example of high-impact, community-driven content.

Collectively, these results reflect a year of meaningful digital growth, stronger community connection, and improved communication effectiveness. The club's digital channels continue to play a crucial role in uniting members, celebrating achievements, and enhancing the visibility of the East Malvern Knights across the wider community.

Merchandise Report – Sally Wajszel

2025 Merch sales kicked off in February with the introduction of compulsory training tops for preseason training. This saw a big uptick in training top purchases especially amongst the teenaged playing groups. We opened online orders early so tops could be collected from Central Park training. This encouraged online ordering and we had over 200 orders to collect on Open Day which lessened the pressure on the volunteers on the day.

Welcome Day was epic! Thank you to the volunteers, committee members (and our kids) who all mucked in to hand out online orders, run sales, refresh stock and give fashion advice. It was definitely less chaotic than previous years due to the Square machines and the early opening of online orders. The rest of the season went by in a blur of red, white and blue. We kept the embroiderers busy with customised Duffle Bags and the roll out of the new wheelie bags for the TMs. Coach's and Team Manager's polos and jackets dominated our time in May. We are still trying to streamline this process as some TMs/Coaches are not appointed at the time and then are frustrated we don't have the right size available. This has to be balanced with not carrying excess stock of these expensive items. In May we helped sell the Fight MND socks with over \$9,000 raised.

Big thanks to the committee who helped with stocktake this year. What an amazing bunch!

Finally, could we put feelers out for some volunteers for Merch Shop on Fridays? Due to my and my children's ever expanding commitments I will not be able to be there all the time every week. My current helpers are my kids' age bracket (over 13s) and even they are avoiding me during footy season! Could we attract some of the new parents with younger players?

Duties include:

- Manning the store 4pm - 6.30pm Fridays. No cash handling.
- Help on Friday during the day to pack online orders.
- Driving to Moorabbin to collect boxes of merch. Lifting & carrying required.

Looking forward to the 2026 season - we aim to streamline WIX and Square. Potentially build a merch online store on Square.
