A huge initiative installed under the banner of “Child Safety” was that of the Club’s Concussion Policy, which was introduced at the start of the season. The Club is very proud that it was the first club in the league to initiate a Concussion Policy and, indeed, had published their policy in advance of the league itself mandating any proper procedures in relation to concussion.

The Committee is incredibly grateful to all those who were involved in the implementation and management of the Concussion Policy. In particular, our Club Concussion Officer, David Munro. David’s expertise as a practising physiotherapist and one who enjoys a speciality in the area of child and adolescent concussion was an integral part of the implementation and management of the Concussion Policy.

A number of our players suffered concussion this year. The parents, team managers and players all adopted this policy excellently. David Munro was able to maintain a register of players who had suffered concussion and was diligent in following up on every player’s individual management and ultimate return to football.

The Club is very proud of its Pastoral Care Policy. The care and support we provide to all our players through the coaches, team managers and parental group ensures that all of our players have a safe and enjoyable time whilst a member of the East Malvern Knights. The Club also acknowledges the involvement of our Club Chaplain, Vicki Mustafa, and thanks her for her efforts throughout the year. Vicki attended most training evenings on a Friday. She introduced herself to many parents and coaches and is always available to assist any member of the Club should the need arise.

I hope that all members of our East Malvern Knights family has a restful and enjoyable summer break. Hopefully 2022 will run seamlessly without any further COVID-related mishap.

Secretary's Report

The little thing known as COVID-19 that ruined the 2020 Season for the Mighty Knights, also put a significant dampener on Season 2021 too! Due to the uncertainty of what we may/may not be able to do due ever-changing COVID restrictions, registrations were not as high as we had expected, but we still had over 860 players sign up to play across 40 teams with the Mighty Knights!

With COVID safety plans firmly in place, the season kicked off on 18th of April. We managed to get in 6 rounds of footy before a snap lockdown saw players sit on the sidelines for four weeks. Then it was back for a brief two week spell before another "snap two week lockdown" (that lasted seven weeks) knocked us down again. The League did a lot of juggling to get the fixtures lined up for us to play a round or two followed by a reduced finals campaign but after one match good old Dan hit us with another "two week snap lockdown" and it was all over! Season done after 8 rounds of footy! Not exactly ideal but at least better than last year...

The League has again pulled together a brief series of Footy For Fun as they did last year but given the time and effort everyone had to put in to make it all work last year, the committee decided that the Knights would not participate. Cricket & basketball are back & we thought that the kids would just like to focus on their other sports & on getting back to school to see their mates. Our key focus of providing a safe environment for our kids & parents to enjoy football, supporting the development of our players and encouraging respect & integrity within the Knights community continues (with extra safety measures in place in adherence with Government & League/AFL COVID guidelines whatever they may be next year)

Club numbers were up slightly compared to last year, but we hope to be back up above 900 players again next year. We ended up having one U17.5 team for the first time in a number of years (they were looking good for a flag but alas never made it to finals). In another first, we had our first merged team with our U18 girls team merging with St Paul's. This was made successful thanks to a lot of work by Kaz Gough & Paul from St Paul's.

In my fourth year in the club secretary role I have continued to work closely with the SMJFL & built on the previously established strong relationship. The team at the League were appreciative of our attention to detail & assistance with regards to the ever-moving fixtures that were affected by the continual going into/coming out of lockdown. The League did a fantastic job of giving the players the best season that they possibly could, dealing with the continual changing of COVID rules & lockdowns getting in the way of a full season.

A big thanks to the League and all Mighty Knights players, volunteers & parents who continue to work together to make the Knights the wonderful club that it is. And many thanks to my fellow committee members for all their hard work over the year (including those non committee members who work "behind the scenes")...without their tireless efforts, we would not be the club that we are today.

Looking forward to a normal season (not a "COVID normal" season) playing lots & lots of footy in 2022!

EMJFC Football Department – Mick Hegan, Carl Callenbach, Lori Embelton and Karen Gough

The Football Department began its work for the 2021 season in September of 2020, what a mighty season 2020 wasn't. By October 2020 the following preparations had commenced:

- Coaching expressions of interest had been sought with those appointed for 2019
- Estimation of all age groups re players for 2021 for the purposes of team nominations with the SMJFL
- Nominations of players for St Kilda NGA and SMJFL Interleague purposes
- Appointment of specialist coaches including B&D Sports for kicking skills and Malcolm Bangs for tackling
- Appointing age group co-ordinators for each year level
- Timetables and venues for pre-season training
- Organisation of some pre-season games both internal and external
- Accreditation from AFL via Coach.AFL for all Knights coaches
- Liaising with Malvern District Auskick regarding potential numbers for under 8's
- Updating the Football Policy
- Preparation had begun for the annual Mosman Swans Football trip for boys and girls

Numbers and recruiting

The 2021 season promised to be a year full of promise and enjoyment for all players given the loss of the 2020 season. The 2021 season was again interrupted by the Covid pandemic however, footy finally commenced for all clubs, we were able to have a reasonable pre-season. Families were relieved and kids excited, officially footy was underway as of April 18th and things were looking great until the season came to a close early August as the big 'C' again raised its ugly head, footy was cooked.

The club had retained a large percentage of existing players whilst also attracting many new players from outside the club. The team participation was to be 40 teams, down 1 from 2019. Refer table comparison next page.

The club's player participation was similar to 2020, we will keep an eye on u8 – u10 participation as this is the key age groups kids have a go at a competitive level for the first time. The following schools are the key feeder primary schools in the local area (Malvern, Lloyd Street, Solway, St Marys, St Rochs and Caulfield Grammar), these schools make up the majority of under 8-10 players.

This season the club experienced lower than expected registrations in both Youth Girls, u15 and u17 Boys. The Football department would like to acknowledge the energy and enthusiasm of the following people.

Firstly, Karen Gough (Youth Girls and Knights committee member). Karen touched base with Paul Smith, (President of St Pauls and St Pauls Youth Girls coach). Karen was able to successfully identify another club that was also short on numbers, together both clubs put forth a merged team whereby the team played in both clubs jumpers and experienced a wonderful season. Thank you Karen and Paul.

Secondly, Simon Bell our President. Simon touched base with Glen Iris Gladiator reps being Anthony Smith and Paul Cooper. As a result of this proactive engagement we were able to put two u15 boys teams on the field and one u17.5 boys team. Thank you Simon, Anthony and Paul. We are also thrilled to announce that Anthony Smith will be the AGC for our u16 Boys in 2022.

In May the Knights hosted a Girls Footy event on a beautiful Friday afternoon at Lucas Oval. A number of ex-Knights AFLW players came along to support and coach the girls in some drills for the younger age groups and a game for the U16 girls. Thanks to Alicia Eva, Eliza McNamara, and Abbi Moloney for coming along to the event to encourage the girls with their football skills and talk to the group in a questions and answers session afterwards. Thanks also to our AFLW ambassador Kate McCarthy for sharing her insights at the panel discussion on the road to becoming an AFLW footballer. We are hoping the event has inspired some of our up-and-coming female footballers to follow their football dreams. Thanks to our sponsors Hey little fishy, Shakez, and Round12 Fitness for their support on the evening.

In late May the Knights also hosted a last minute visit from our PM the Honourable Scott Morrison, local member Michael Obrien and state MP Katie Allen. Along with his entourage he chatted to the boys and girls who were training on the oval, engaging in a kicking drill with the boys and a handballing drill with the girls. Thanks to Brad Jukes for organising the event, I am sure Knights players enjoyed seeing themselves in the paper and on the TV that night.

A big thankyou to Mick Hegan who has dedicated an enormous amount of time and effort to keep the football department humming over the last year through difficult circumstances.

Objectives of the Football Department

Our key objective is to create a safe, supportive and fun environment for all our players and families. Key objectives for 2021 continued to include:

- Maintain participation rates (I want to come back and play next year)
- Sportsmanship and fair play
- Environment and program that fosters learning (I learned my footy at the Knights)
- Build and maintain a strong sense of community (community club not school-based club)
- Develop players to transition into school, youth and then senior football
- Increase female participation on and off the field
- To improve the level of education for our coaches across all facets of the game.
- To provide a wonderful experience for all participants

Grading in 2021

Given recent experience, and consistent with clear expectations communicated by the SMJFL, the club intended to commence internal hard grading at under 12 mixed level in 2020. Owing to Covid impacting the last two seasons, we haven't commenced hard grading at the u12 mixed level. The intention will be to commence hard grading of u12 Mixed in 2022. The football department reserves the right to assess the number of registrations in 2022, it may not be wise to hard grade all teams in this age group.

We will also look at potentially hard grading u12 girls depending on the number of registrations received or 2022.

Summer Footy for Fun

The committee elected not to lodge teams this time around. We felt that families would be looking forward to cricket, netball, basketball or just getting out of Melbourne. Another persuading factor was the amount of work required as a committee for only a few weeks of football.

EMJFC Football Operations – Patrick Charles, Jonathan Brown, Gill Rush

Another COVID affected year! In 2020 we asked the question: What do you write about 'Football Operations' in a year without football? In 2021 we improved on matches played from 2020, but the abrupt end to the season again meant that 95% of the work in footy operations was completed for less than 50% of the football expected.

We were MUCH more organized in 2021, and with the support of our 'boss' Mick Hegan, equipment and jumper allocation went very smoothly.... And the rats hadn't got to the first aid kits. Nish Kothari returned as grounds manager for a second year (also completing his ERC training which gave us absolute redundancy on Sundays if trainers were absent). A new team of u16 boys came down on Sunday mornings to assist with the setup, which went well mostly, although we probably need to look at at least one more paid helper on a Sunday, and most weekends a member of the Ops team had to help out with setup and packup.

Training was easier to manage than in 2020 – as we had access to Lucas Pavilion. Although a logistical challenge, we did really well with getting all trainers up to speed for the start of the season (even managing to host an ERC session at the Knights which was great). We again ran additional zoom sessions on concussion management and injury prevention which were well received.

We did focus quite a bit on logistics / equipment for footy ops – this included:

- The purchase of walkie talkies for grounds management (thanks Belly!)
- 2 new de-fibrillators and storage cabinets (thanks Shane Yole!)
- 4 new marquees for use at Stanley Grose / functions... which are fantastic and still brand new!
- A new end-of-season storage setup in the cage with training bags and balls stored on hooks providing additional space

The return of all kit was quite rushed (as we had 1 week between lockdown and handover to complete), but was a great success, with fantastic numbers of helpers (almost too many). The equipment is well sorted, neatly packed, and has us really well set up for 2022.

The Footy Ops team for 2022 will include both Patrick and Jono returning, but we will be saying goodbye and thanks to Gil (and Shane who technically resigned, but stick around). Having four members in the team was fantastic, enabling us to spread the load for what is an onerous undertaking. We are especially thankful for Shane's expertise with First Aid, Rat traps and the steaming of Dim Sims. Gil was an amazing asset for 2021 ensuring kit was allocated, recorded and well managed - his meticulous accounts of the ins and outs were unsurpassed.

We are hopeful that at least one other member, and preferably two, will be recruited into the team for next year

Footy Ops relies on the assistance and contribution of everyone at the club, and we were very lucky in 2021 that we got a huge amount of support from the committee... and also from other members of the Knights community – but still we owe additional thanks to

- Mick Hegan as always – We view footy ops as a sub-committee of Footy Dept, so Mick is our boss!
- Shane Yole and Gil Ruston – no longer on footy ops – but still always helping out
- Simon, Caz, Doogs, Anne and the committee have all assisted us greatly in their own ways!

We certainly learned from 2020, and had a much more organized and successful 2021 – and it really does feel that we are well set up for next year!

Communications Report – Anne Moore

In 2021 the aim was to create a consistent and engaging presence for our members through regular updates of game day photos and upcoming events throughout the season via social media.

Our website saw an increase in site views from 7491 in 2020 to 8702 in 2021 (an increase of 22%) with a 6% increase in unique visitors. The majority of visitors utilized google to find the website or went direct.

We now have 1207 followers on Instagram (24% growth on last year) & 845 followers on Facebook (21% increase on 2020). Our social media posts have also grown in engagement with an average reach on Facebook of 489 for photo and 229 for video posts. On Instagram our highest engagement post came from the surprise visit of Prime Minister His Honourable Scott Morrison with 422 interactions and an engagement rate of 26%.

In 2022, in conjunction with our Sponsorship manager we will be aiming to provide greater return on investment for our sponsors through targeted promotion throughout the season.
